

# BESPOKE COURSES

<b>H&amp;S - Legionella Awareness</b>	This course aims to help duty-holders to understand more about their legal responsibilities, and the health risks created by Legionella bacteria, so that a risk assessment can be done and suitable control measures can be implemented.
<b>Working at Heights</b>	This course describes the learner's responsibilities under the Work at Height Regulations 2005 and teaches them how to work safely and in accordance with the law. It explains how to carry out a risk assessment, how to select and implement control to eliminate or reduce risk and how to use work at height equipment safely.
<b>Emergency First Aid at Work (1 day)</b>	This course is designed to teach learners the basics of workplace first aid, giving them the confidence to recognise emergency situations and take appropriate action to treat common injuries and conditions.
<b>First Aid at Work (3 days)</b>	This course is suitable for people aged 16+ who might need to provide first aid by responding to a wide range accidents, injuries and illnesses that they could encounter in their workplace.
<b>Abrasive Wheels</b>	This course is designed to help learners work safely with abrasive wheels. The course assists learners to understand the risks and outlines the control measures needed to ensure the health and safety of abrasive wheel users.
<b>Asbestos Awareness</b>	This course is suitable for anyone who may be exposed to asbestos at work. The course helps learners understand how to work safely, avoid disturbing ACMs, and ensure their work activities are compliant with the Control of Asbestos Regulations 2012.
<b>Infection Control Awareness</b>	This course educates the learner about the importance of sufficient infection control at work. It familiarises them with sources of infections, how infections can transmit from host to host, and the effective preventative measures and remedial actions that help stop infections from transmitting.
<b>Manual Handling</b>	This course aims to give you the knowledge needed in order to carry out manual handling in a safe way. The course explains how to assess the risks to health, and how to carry out safe manual handling practices correctly.
<b>Risk Assessment</b>	This course teaches learners how to carry out an effective risk assessment of their workplace and work activities to ensure that any hazards are properly managed. It explains the hierarchy of control and provides information on how to assess the hazards and select appropriate control measures, and includes a section on assessing the risks from COVID-19.

<b>Health &amp; Safety in the Workplace Level 2</b>	<p>This Level 2 course explains the most common health and safety risks in workplaces and the control measures that are needed to prevent them. The course covers some essential health and safety topics, including fire safety, electrical safety, manual handling, display screen equipment and workplace stress.</p>
<b>Fire Safety Level 2</b>	<p>This course has been specifically designed for anyone who has a specific responsibility for fire safety in the workplace, such as designated fire wardens/fire marshals. Candidates will gain an understanding of fire safety management at work and the specific roles and responsibilities related to fire safety in the workplace.</p>
<b>Fire Warden</b>	<p>This course will provide you with the necessary training required to be a qualified fire warden. It will educate you about what your legal duties are, will provide you with an understanding of fire, familiarise you with fire hazards and fire safety arrangements, and detail what your emergency evacuation procedures should entail. The information in the course will enable you to take responsibility for fire safety in your workplace and protect everyone's wellbeing.</p>
<b>Practical Fire Extinguisher Awareness</b>	<p>This course teaches learners how to use the various types of fire extinguishers safely. It looks at the different classes of fire, how to select the right extinguisher for the class involved, and how to assess the situation to decide whether you should or shouldn't fight a fire.</p>
<b>National Water Hygiene (EUSR)</b>	<p>This EUSR course has been specifically designed for all persons who come in to contact with potable water. Any person working on service reservoirs, pumping stations, treatment works, wells, spring and boreholes and working on the network of water mains and service pipes must be in possession of a National Water Hygiene card. Successful completion of the course allows registration with EUSR for issue of the blue National Water Hygiene card, lasting 3 years.</p>
<b>Safety Awareness in the use of High Pressure Water Jetting Equipment</b>	<p>This course is aimed at those who may be required to use High Pressure Water jetting equipment as part of their job or those who are required to manage and supervise staff using this type of equipment.</p>
<b>Drain &amp; Sewer Jetting</b>	<p>This course is aimed at those who use, or supervise the use of, high pressure water jetting equipment for cleaning drains, sewers, pipes, culverts, tanks and manholes.</p>
<b>Confined Spaces Medium Risk</b>	<p>This course is suitable for anyone whose work requires them to enter a confined space, including employees, managers, supervisors and rescuers. The course is designed as an introduction to working safely in confined spaces and so no pre-requisite training is needed.</p>
